No zoo can compare to the savanna and bush, where exotic animals run wild in their natural surroundings hunting, mating, and playing. And there is nobody like the people of East Africa. Marvel at their resilience, culture, and way of life. You will gain a new perspective as you interact and engage with people in local communities and develop a new appreciation for the little things in life. This experience will change your life.

Wildlife Itinerary

Day 1:

Depart the USA

Day 2:

Arrive in Entebbe where you will be transferred to Golf View Inn for your overnight.

Day 3:

After breakfast, depart for Lake Mburo National Park. Along the way stop at the Equator for pictures and refreshments. Lying in the one part of Uganda covered in extensive acacia woodland, Mburo has strikingly different fauna to other reserves. It harbors several large antelope species not easily observed elsewhere in Uganda. It is the only reserve in the country to support a population of Impala, the handsome antelope Kampala town is named after, and one of only three protected areas where Burchell's zebra occurs. First-time visitors to Lake Mburo National Park are fascinated by the variety of large mammals and colorful birds. Upon arrival enjoy lunch at the tented camp.



In the afternoon when the temperatures have cooled down, you will have an exciting game walk to a salt lick where many animals congregate to enjoy the mineral salts. You will be accompanied by a ranger guide to ensure your safety as you enjoy the sights and sounds of the African bush.

Dinner and overnight at Kimbala-Mantan Tented Camp.

Day 4

After breakfast, you will travel to Bwindi National Park in southwestern Uganda. Bwindi is among the most biologically diverse forests in Africa, largely due to its antiquity (it dates to before the Pleistocene Ice Age, making it 25,000 years old) and an altitude range of 3,000 to 8,500 feet above

western edge of the Albertine Rift Valley. In addition to mountain gorillas, there are estimated to be 120 species of mammals, making it second only to Queen Elizabeth National Park among Ugandan national parks. Other primates found in the forest include chimpanzees, olive baboons, black-and-white colobus and L'Hoest, red-tailed and blue monkeys. There are an estimated 346 species of birds, including 23 localized species found only in the Albertine Rift Valley. There are also more than 200 butterfly species and 324 identified tree species, 10 of which only exist in this area of the country.



Upon arrival, you will have lunch and go for a village walk to meet and learn more about the local community living around the park and witness how gorilla tourism in this area is benefiting them. The three-hour walk will introduce you to the customs and practices of the Batwa (Pygmies) and Bakiga people. Some of the places you will visit include a local handicraft shop that is run by the women of the community. The women design and produce a wide variety of beautiful traditional crafts such as mats, wood carvings, dyed clothes, weavings and much more. They earn revenue from the sales of their works to meet their living costs. Additional revenues are used to support the school and orphanage.

The walk then leads you through well-groomed tea plantations that thrive on the rich fertile volcanic soils of the Albertine rift valley, where you will learn about the cultivation, processing and distribution of tea. You will then stroll through small food gardens and open fields where boys herd the beautiful long-horned Ankole cattle.

Dinner and overnight at Engagi Lodge Bwindi

Day 5

After an early breakfast (07:00hrs), you will have the opportunity to track the first group of mountain gorillas. Tracking these fascinating creatures through the misty Ugandan forests requires patience and stamina, not to mention the long but hopeful hours spent walking in the mud and the wet rainforest floor. But the payoff is indescribable: there is no way to describe the thrill of coming upon a family of gorillas going about their daily activities in the undergrowth. The opportunity to trek within metres of

one of the world's last few hundred mountain gorillas is arguably the most exciting wildlife encounter in Africa.

The gorillas live in groups of 8 to 25 members and we share 97% of the same genes with them. A family scene is captivating; mothers with babies hanging on their chests, youngsters playing more than foraging; several in trees, throwing down an occasional berry or fruit; one picking at the head of another; many merely resting under a bush or alongside a fallen tree. A picnic lunch will be provided. Return to the lodge and spend the afternoon at leisure. After freshening up you will visit the Bwindi Orphanage for a dance and drama performance by the children.



Dinner and overnight at Engagi Lodge Bwindi.

Day 6

After breakfast, depart for Queen Elizabeth N.P. The drive will take you through the southern



sector of the park and you will have a game drive at Ishasha. The Ishasha plains rank with the most appealing game-viewing areas in the country, as much for its unspoiled mood as its varied wildlife. The area is famous for its lions, one of the few populations in Africa that customarily climb trees. To see a pride of up to 14 lions up a tree, all fast asleep with huge distended bellies will leave you with fond memories of Africa. You will stop at Ishasha Wilderness Camp for lunch.

From open savannah to rainforest, dense papyrus swamps and brooding crater lakes to the vastness of Lake Edward, it is little wonder that QENP boasts one of the highest biodiversity ratings of any game reserve in the world. Almost 130 mammal species and a remarkable 606 bird species makes this

superb safari territory, with elephant, lions, buffaloes, a profusion of hippos, the elusive giant forest hog and handsome Uganda kob, water bucks and so much more, all regularly sighted around the tourist village on the Mweya Peninsula - which also boasts a marvelous waterfront setting in the shadow of the Rwenzori Mountains.

Proceed to Jacana Lodge for dinner and overnight.

Day 7

Early in the morning you will be driven to the Kyambura gorge. The steep Kyambura Gorge formed by the turbulent waters of the roaring Kyambura River, provides a lush riverine tropical forest right in the middle of the savannah dominated park. This forest is home to the chimps that have been habituated to human presence. You will be accompanied by a professional ranger-guide who will tell you more about chimps and the forest as he leads you through the giant trees and undergrowth vines. You'll hear them before you see them: from somewhere deep in the forest, an excited hooting, just one voice at first, then several, rising in volume and tempo and pitch to a frenzied unified crescendo, before



stopping abruptly or fading away. Chimps are amazing animals which share many similarities with us (98.7% DNA). They hug and kiss each other, live in family groups, enjoy the company of others and they are able to think through problems and use tools. Tracking our closest cousins in their natural habitat is quite a rewarding, exciting and educational experience. The area is also home to the black and white colobus, red tailed monkeys, olive baboons and other large mammals like elephants, hippos, and antelopes, as well as plenty of forest birds.

Enjoy your lunch at Mweya Safari Lodge.



At 3:00pm you will have a leisurely boat cruise down the Kazinga channel where you will see more of the wild animals as they come down to water and cool off. Enjoy the unique 2 hour boat cruise on the Channel into Lake Edward. This trip passes through possibly the highest concentration of hippos. This launch cruise offers an excellent platform for photography, bird watching and game

viewing. The prolific bird life is colorful and remarkable with well over 550 resident species. Expect to see elephants, hippos, crocodiles, buffaloes, antelopes and lots of beautiful water birds.

Dinner and overnight at Jacana Lodge

Day 8

Return to Entebbe with lunch en route.

Dinner and overnight at Golf View Inn.

Day 9

Today you can spend the day at leisure. Visit the nearby Botanical Gardens. The gardens which were established in 1902 are an attractive blend of indigenous forest, cultivation and horticulture. Sprawling along the Lake Victoria shore, the tranquil manicured gardens are home to small wildlife like vervet monkeys, black-and-white colobus monkeys, tree squirrels and a host of beautiful forest and water birds. Breakfast and lunch will be served at the Golf View Inn.

Later you will be transferred to the airport for your departure flight.

Day 10

Arrive back in the U.S

TOUR EXTENSIONS

5-DAY WILDLIFE & CULTURAL SAFARI IN TANZANIA

Day 1

Arrive at Kilimanjaro International Airport in the afternoon. Transport to Kia Lodge where you spend the remainder of the afternoon by the pool or at your leisure. Enjoy the beautiful landscaping. Dinner and overnight at Kia Lodge.

Day 2

Leave early after breakfast for Ngorongoro Crater. The Ngorongoro Crater is often called 'Africa's Eden' and the '8th Natural Wonder of the World.' A visit to the crater is a main attraction for tourists coming to Tanzania and a definite world-class attraction. Within the crater rim, large herds of zebra and wildebeest graze while sleeping lions laze nearby in the sun. You will spend a full day in the crater, with a stop for a picnic lunch. Dinner and overnight on the crater rim at Ngorongoro Serena Lodge.



Day 3

Game drives in Serengeti National Park. This area of East Africa's savannah plains has attracted humans for millennia. The whole area is now colloquially known as the short grass plains and is the preferred habitat of hundreds of thousands (perhaps more than a million) of wildebeest. They feel safest here, choosing this location year after year to give birth to their young. Lunch, dinner and overnight at Serengeti Serena Safari Lodge.

Day 4

Morning and evening game drives the Serengeti to find the elusive leopard and cheetah. Relaxation midday. Lunch, dinner and overnight at Serengeti Serena Safari Lodge.

Day 5

Fly from Serengeti to Arusha then return home via Entebbe or directly from Tanzania back to the US.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF TRAVEL

HOW TO BOOK: Fill out the reservation form and send it to Ujuzi African Travel, 166 Dunning St., Madison WI 53704, together with a deposit of \$750 per person, plus \$250 per person for each tour extension. Add another \$400 per person for the inter-country flight between Uganda and Tanzania, if you choose the Tanzanian tour extension. On receipt of your signed reservation form and deposit, we (Ujuzi African Travel, LLC or "UAT") will, subject to availability, reserve your place on a tour/safari/trek. When we send your confirmation invoice, your booking is confirmed and you have a contract with us. Final payment is due no later than 95 days prior to departure. Final documents will be sent to you approximately two weeks prior to departure.

AIR TRANSPORTATION:

International. All of Ujuzi African Travel's tours/safaris/treks start from Entebbe, Uganda. You are responsible for the booking of and payment for your international flight from the U.S.A. to Entebbe, Uganda. UAT offers a service to book airline tickets for its clients for international flights – see the section below titled **BOOKING INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS THROUGH UAT**. The payment for these flights will be arranged separately from the tour booking.

Intra-country. We will book your intra-country flight (and any flights between Uganda and Tanzania, should you choose the Tanzanian tour extension) upon receiving your deposit for the flight. Prices for these flights are subject to change. All planes are non-smoking. For groups, we will attempt to book seats together and we can request other seating preferences on your behalf, however, we cannot guarantee seating location or arrangements for any flight. Submit your seating requests to us in writing no later than 60 days prior to your U.S.A. departure. Bulkhead and/ or emergency row seats can only be requested at airport check-in on the day of departure. Boarding passes will only be issued at the airport on the day of departure. You may inquire during check-in to have a seating change made, however, seating is based on availability and changes are made at the sole discretion of airline staff.

Departure Taxes. NOTICE - the amount of departure tax required to be paid with your airfare is subject to change without advance notice, at the discretion of governments and airlines. Should such a change occur, you will be invoiced prior to departure for any additional taxes imposed. Departure tax and air fees are non-refundable.

Baggage: International flights from the US allow two pieces of checked luggage, each not exceeding 50 lbs. However we recommend you travel as light as you can manage, and preferably bring one bag. The baggage limit on Ugandan domestic flights is one piece at 33 lbs. per person (plus a carry-on bag). Also, the size and the structure of the bag are limited. Soft duffel bags are ideal. Large suitcases are virtually impossible to stow on smaller aircraft and vehicles and should not be used. Consider bringing a small backpack as one of your carry-ons, shared between two people. A backpack will be convenient when seeing the mountain gorillas and chimps, and on our walks and boat rides. Travel insurance covers delayed or lost baggage.

SUPPLIERS OF SERVICES: Unless the term "guaranteed" is specifically stated in writing on your ticket, invoice, or reservation itinerary, Ujuzi African Travel does not guarantee any airline's or other supplier's rates, bookings, reservations, connections, scheduling, or handling of baggage or other personal effects. We have researched and typically have experience with the suppliers we recommend. You acknowledge, however, that the ticket issued to you by the airline or other supplier constitutes the sole contract between you and the supplier. UAT acts only as an intermediary between you and the suppliers.

REPLACEMENTS: We reserve the right to make small modifications to your tour which you agree will not change your payment obligations. For example, if one of the guides reserved for your tour/safari/trek is unexpectedly unable to take your group, we will substitute with another guide; or we may have to replace a transportation supplier for a leg of your tour; on rare occasions, we may have to replace the lodging listed in your itinerary to different but equivalent lodging.

DELAYS: If you miss the intra-country flight scheduled for the first morning of your tour (Day 2), we have arranged for alternative ground transportation to your first destination, but the intra-country flight is highly preferable. If an airline delay or any other reason causes you to miss that first intra-country flight or any scheduled transportation which is part of your tour package, we are not liable for your missing the next or any leg of your tour, nor are we liable for any additional costs incurred as a result of the delay.

ACCOMODATIONS: You will marvel at the wonderful accommodations provided throughout your tour. All rooms have private facilities. All rates are based on double occupancy, that is, two people sharing a room. Most rooms are twin-bedded. Single occupancy rooms, if available, will be assigned on a first-come-first-served basis at additional cost (see reservation form for the cost). With single occupancy you may gain privacy, but, typically, not additional amenities. On occasion, in smaller lodges and camps, you may be required to share lodging with another member of your tour group if single rooms are not available. For passengers who are traveling alone and wish to share a room with another tour member, we will do our best to provide a roommate. However, if this is not possible, you will be required to pay the single occupancy supplement prior to your departure from the U.S.A. The accommodations listed in your itinerary are current as of April, 2008.

MEALS: No meals are provided by UAT on your travel to Entebbe, Uganda or on your return travel to the U.S.A. (such meals, however, may be provided by your airline). Meals are provided with your tour package starting with breakfast on Day 2 (you will arrive late on Day 1, between 9:00 p.m. and midnight Ugandan time). UAT will not provide any meals after breakfast on Day 15 of your tour (in other words, you will be responsible for lunch and dinner on Day 15).

WILDLIFE VIEWING: All wildlife viewing in Uganda is by 4x4 open-air vehicles, driven by a local driver. All wildlife viewing in Tanzania on the optional tour extension safari will be by 4x4 open-air vehicles. You and all in your group will be able to sit in a window seat. **NO SMOKING WILL BE ALLOWED IN VEHICLES.**

TOUR INFORMATION: Upon receipt of your completed reservation application, instructions and information will be sent to you concerning almost all aspects of your trip, including an itinerary, online travel journal, photographic equipment, documents, clothing, insurance, etc. You will also receive information about the volunteer opportunity we have arranged for your tour to contribute to the improvement of the social welfare of a Ugandan community or organization.

Schedules, accommodations, and prices are accurate as of February, 2009. They are subject to change.



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RATES: All rates quoted are based on tariffs in effect and the value of foreign currencies in relation to the U.S. dollar as of April 16, 2008, and are subject to change. All charges and fees are quoted in U.S. dollars. Rates are based on a minimum of either 6 or 12 passengers traveling together (rates will be higher for less than 6 passengers; rates will be higher for 7 to 11 passengers). We reserve the right to levy a surcharge if the minimum is not met, however, in practice, we rarely do. We will do our utmost to keep to the prices as published. Tour pricing and rates will be re-quoted as we receive new information.

TIPS AND TAXES: Gratuities for baggage handling; service charges and taxes imposed by hotels, lodges and tented camps; entrance fees; and tips for drivers/guides of your tour, are all included in the price of your tour package in Uganda. You are welcome to make an additional tip to any supplier at your discretion.

NOT INCLUDED: The cost of passport and visa fees, and service charges for obtaining visa fees; excess baggage charges levied by airlines; the cost of meals not provided or arranged by UAT as specified above; the cost of alcoholic beverages; the cost of laundry and other items of a personal nature; tour, baggage or personal property insurance coverage; tips for drivers, guides and meals in Tanzania, and anything not specifically listed as included in this Agreement is not included in your tour price. U.S.A. and foreign airport taxes are not included in your UAT tour price and will be billed prior to your departure from the U.S.A.

INVOICING: UAT will send you a confirmation invoice within approximately two weeks of receipt of your completed reservation application. Payment of the balance due for your tour must be received by UAT no later than 95 days prior to the scheduled date for your U.S.A. departure.

FINAL DOCUMENTS: Final documents and tickets will be sent to you approximately two weeks prior to your U.S.A. departure. We regret to advise that no documents will be released if final payment from you has not been received by UAT.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE: The deposit of \$750 per person must be submitted with each application, plus \$250 per person for each tour extension, and \$400 for each inter-country flight if you choose a tour extension. Deposits may be paid by check, cash, or money order. Final payment may be made by check or money order only and is due no later than 95 days prior to your scheduled U.S.A. departure.

CANCELLATIONS: Cancellations are effective only upon UAT's receipt of written notice. The following per person cancellation fees apply to your tour:

- If we receive your notice more than 95 days prior to your scheduled U.S.A. departure date, we will refund the total of your deposits and payments less \$200 per person handling fee.
- There will be no refunds for cancellations made 95 days or less before departure, including cancellations due to actual or threatened terrorist events. There will be no refund due to fear of travel from actual or threatened terrorist events.

(Your international flight airline may charge an additional cancellation fee.)

CHANGE FEES: Once you reserve your tour, changes are possible subject to availability of air or land space at the time of request. Should there be any change fees imposed by airlines or ground operators, or additional costs incurred due to availability of any space, this cost will be invoiced to you.

LATE BOOKING FEE: UAT may impose a late booking fee of \$250 per person to offset our additional administrative costs for any reservation received less than 95 days prior to a tour's U.S.A. departure date. Individual airlines and other suppliers may charge additional late booking fees. You will be invoiced for all late booking fees. Payment for late booking fees will be due immediately upon your receipt of our invoice.

DEVIATIONS: Should you require reservations and arrangements for tour extensions involving other destinations in Africa or Europe, we will be happy to make all the arrangements. However, you will be responsible for the charges for any additional air travel and suppliers, and we will charge you an additional fee of \$150 per person for arranging such tour extensions.

CHANGES TO SCHEDULES: We will use our best commercial efforts to see that schedules are adhered to, however, we reserve the right and may be obliged to occasionally change routes and camps on tours or safaris as dictated by changing conditions or members of your tour group. Such conditions may be caused by seasonal rainfall on bush tracks, airfields and in wildlife areas, by wildlife migrations from one region to another, airline or other transportation problems, or the health or behavior of one or more members of your tour group, etc.

REFUNDS: UAT will use its best commercial efforts to ensure that the accommodations in your UAT-issued itinerary are available as planned. If any accommodation or excursion becomes unavailable, we will use reasonable commercial efforts to substitute a substantially equivalent alternative. You will not receive a refund as a result of a substitution or if a substantially equivalent alternative cannot be found due to circumstances beyond our control. If you are unable to use any service included in your UAT-provided itinerary, there shall be no refunds due.

PASSPORT AND VISAS: You are completely and fully responsible for, and hereby release Ujuzi African Travel from, any responsibility for checking, verifying and complying with any and all passport, visa, vaccination, or other entry requirements of each destination. You are responsible for checking and verifying all safety and security conditions for each destination on your tour and accepting these conditions. We will forward visa information to you upon receipt of your reservation. For information concerning possible dangers at international destinations, access the State Department's online travel advisory service at: <http://travel.state.gov/travel/warnings.html>.

HEALTH AND VACCINATIONS: We suggest you contact your personal physician or local health department for their recommendations as to inoculations/vaccinations applicable or recommended for your tour destinations. It is a sensible precaution for visitors to Africa to also take preventive pills against malaria. Water is not safe to drink throughout Africa and we advise you to drink bottled water while you are there. For medical information about travel to Africa, access the U.S. Centers for Disease Control website at www.cdc.gov/travel.

WILD ANIMALS: You are advised that your tour/safari/trek may involve your close contact with wild animals. Attacks by wild animals are rare, but no tour/safari/trek into the African wilderness can guarantee that this will not occur. You agree that UAT, its employees or agents, Anne Medeiros or Carol Mutesi shall not be responsible for injury or damage to property resulting from your close contact with wild animals while on your UAT-arranged tour. You acknowledge that not all camps on your tour will be fenced.
